I hope this finds all of you doing well. It is hard to believe that summer is halfway over and that schools start next month. I hope all of you have enjoyed family, friends, and neighbors during this great time of year.

Since school will be starting, that means there will be increased traffic in our city. This brings up a topic that the council hears about regularly –**SPEEDING THAT TAKES PLACE IN OUR CITY**. Councilman Jeff Weis will be presenting a motion at the August meeting to install two (2) speed humps in the 4300 blocks of St. Regis Lane, Lincoln Road, Dannywood Road, Mount Vernon Road and Foxy Poise Road, near the Lynnbrook Drive intersection. I highly encourage residents to contact Mr. Weis or attend the August meeting to discuss their opinions and the pros and cons regarding the installation of speed humps.

I would like to thank Councilman Louie Schweickhardt for overseeing the US Flags that were put out this year (and every year) for the 4th of July. It is a great way to celebrate the holiday, be reminded of our independence, and it makes the city look beautiful. Again, thank you to all who participated.

The tree board has now completed their Spring planting season. That means that the City has now planted 210 trees!!!! That is simply amazing. I would still encourage us all to keep moving forward on this initiative. As I mow my yard, I am reminded weekly of the lack of tree canopy we have. Even though I have planted a tree in my yard, it still obviously takes a while to get to the size where it can create a lot of shade. As I drive the city, I still see plenty of yards that could use a new tree or tree maintenance in order for our great city to remain “park-like.” The tree board is also asking everyone to keep their new trees watered, even if they are a few years old. With this extremely hot weather, it is vital.

Angela Leet, the Republican candidate for Mayor of Louisville, will be attending our August meeting.

Last, but not least, the General Election will be held

on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. All seven (7) City Council seats and the Mayor position will be on the ballot. I have informed the council that I will be running for Mayor one last time. Council Members are elected every two (2) years and the Mayor is elected every four (4) years. Candidates must file their forms at the Jefferson County Election Center no later than 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 14, 2018. For information on candidate filing procedures, qualifications for the office, filing fees and sample filing forms, you may call the Jefferson County Election Center at 502-574-5886 or 502-574-5889 or download the “Declaring Your Candidacy” publication at www.sos.ky.gov/elections. The ordinance requirements for a person to be qualified to run for office are the following: 18 years of age; Qualified to vote in the city; Lived in St Regis Park for more than 1 year; and Must reside in St. Regis Park throughout their term.

The City of St. Regis Park is a great place to live. Together, we will make it even better!

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING

July 3, 2018

Following are the Minutes of the July 2018 Council Meeting for the City of St. Regis Park, held at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 3, 2018, at the Jeffersontown Fire Station #2 located at 4318 Taylorsville Road, Louisville, Kentucky 40220.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Mayor Brandt Davis; Council Members: John Amback, Kacy Noltemeyer, Eric Shackelford, Jeff Weis, and Cheryl Willett.

MAYOR’S REPORT:

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Mr. Charles J. Veeneman, the city accountant presented the Financial and Investment Report for June 2018. General Fund revenues for the month of June were \$3,561.13 with year-to-date revenues at \$410,681.07. Total expenses for the month were \$23,682.55, with year-to-date expenses at \$343,409.21, resulting in year-to-date revenues over expenses of \$67,271.86.

Road Fund revenues for the month were \$2,331.77, with year-to-date revenues at \$30,109.30. Total expenses were \$0, with year-to-date expenses at \$10,930.60, resulting in year-to-date revenues over expenses of \$19,178.70.

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to approve the June 2018 financial and investment reports. Mr. Amback seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

MINUTES:

Mr. Shackelford made a motion to approve the June Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting held on June 5, 2018. The motion was seconded by Mr. Weis and it passed, with Ms. Willett dissenting because her comments at the June meeting regarding car break-ins were not included in the minutes.

CITATION OFFICER’S REPORT: JASON LEWIS

Mr. Lewis presented his June 2018 report, which included residents that have multiple yard sales throughout the year and a tree house that does not meet the requirements outlined in the ordinances.

CITY ATTORNEY’S REPORT: JOHN SINGLER

Mr. Singler presented the second reading of Ordinance 5, 2017-2018, an ordinance amending the 2017-2018 fiscal budget. Mr. Weis made a motion to approve the ordinance. Mr. Shackelford seconded the motion and it passed without dissent.

Mr. Singler and Mr. Lewis will be revising the current parking ordinance for the city.

BRANCHING OUT

Trees are an incredibly important part of a community's infrastructure. Perhaps you saw the recent article in the Courier-Journal by Lucas Aulbach that reported that Louisville's heat index was the highest in the country at 12:30 pm Thursday, July 5th. Louisville has a very serious Urban Heat Island (UHI) effect. A UHI is an urban or metropolitan area that is significantly warmer than its surrounding rural areas due to human activities-buildings, black rooftops, roads, etc. Louisville's UHI is more than twice the second fastest warming UHI, Phoenix, AZ.

Dr. Brian Stone, a researcher at Georgia Tech University recently produced a UHI Management Study for Louisville that recommends planting trees as one of the most cost effective and efficient means of mitigating our very serious UHI here in Louisville. Kudos to all of you that have already planted trees in your yards via Saint Regis Park's Canopy improvement program. If you are interested in planting a tree in your yard, please contact Mary Mattingly-one of your hard working volunteer Tree Board members to sign up.

If you already have a new tree (or trees) in your yard, mulch is critical. With the extreme weather conditions, we have been experiencing lately, mulching is one of the best things that you can do to promote tree health. Here's just a partial list of the benefits of proper mulching:

- Controls weed germination and growth
- Protects tree roots from extreme summer and winter temperatures
- Improves soil biology: aeration, structure, drainage, and fertility
- Reduces moisture loss
- Reduces human/mechanical damage

Organic mulch like wood chips, pine needles, and shredded bark are generally preferred over inorganic mulches like lava rock, stones, etc. To mulch in the most effective way:

- Apply a 2 to 4 inch layer of organic mulch over the tree roots
- Spread the mulch out to the edge of the tree's crown-or at least three feet out for newly planted trees
- If mulch has been applied before, check to see if raking it out and fluffing it is enough to "freshen" it up
- Leave at least 3 inches of a mulch free area around the trunk of the tree

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR YARD SALE DAY

IF YOU ARE PARTICIPATING

-----Try to set up in your driveway or yard close to the street to be more visible.

-----Please park your personal vehicle further up in your driveway so that you do not take space on the street in front of your house and thus help keep the area on the street in front of your home open for traffic and allow parking for buyers coming from outside the City. Any suspicious behavior should be reported immediately, so if possible, have a cell phone nearby.

-----People come early, so plan to set up as early as possible.

-----Extra police will patrol that day. For any problem, contact them immediately and try to get the license plate number and a car description of an offender's vehicle.

-----Join with neighbors and hold a multi-house sale at one location for a larger sale.

IF YOU ARE NOT PARTICIPATING

-----Please park your vehicle(s) off the street, but close to the street to avoid your driveway being used as a turn around point.

-----Report any suspicious or unusual activity to the police patrolling the City during the yard sale.

-----If possible, keep your garage door closed during the hours of the yard sale so that it will not attract attention.

There will be *NO PARKING* on the sides of the streets where fire hydrants are located. "No Parking" signs will be posted on Thursday evening, September 6th. Police patrols will ticket those vehicles who do not comply.



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
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
