Greetings residents, I hope everyone had a happy Derby experience and you are looking forward to a great summer. I would like to start off by thanking all of you who came out to our annual Easter Egg Hunt. Judging by all the kids' smiling faces I would call the event another success. I would like to acknowledge Councilperson Cheryl Willett for her efforts in making our city-wide events something we all look forward to. Special thanks to St. Andrew United Church of Christ for so graciously providing the space again this year.

With events in mind, this time of year ushers in graduation parties, baby/wedding showers etc. If you are having a large gathering, please feel free to reach out the city for "No Parking" signs to be placed on one side of the street. This will keep the traffic flowing and significantly reduce risk to pedestrians, bicycles, and automobiles.

I have received calls from some of you asking about the vacant nursing home at the curve on Lowe Road. I am happy to report the property has been purchased by Nicklies Development whose owner lives in our area. The property is in serious disrepair due to looting and vandalism experienced over the past few years. As a first option, if they can find an operator and it is not cost prohibitive, Nicklies intends to renovate the existing buildings by returning them to a nursing facility. If the numbers will not work for renovation due to the building's current state, they intend to demolish and build a new nursing facility. Nicklies said it will take 6-12 months to make a final decision. In the meantime, they will clean up the property, make sure the grass is cut, and secure the building. They have asked us to alert police if we witness any suspicious activity on the property.

Council member Eric Shackleford has recently purchased a home outside of the city and will be stepping down from his position in July. I would like to thank him for his service to our city for the past several years. He has done a great job handling public works duties and been a voice for safety on our streets. Eric is also active in the military so please join me in thanking him for his service to our country.

With Eric's departure we will need to fill the vacant council position quickly. The council members and I will be interviewing for the open position before upcoming

meetings. If you are interested, please contact the city or attend our upcoming meetings, we will make sure you are aware of the interview process.

Finally, residents on Woodward Ave. are having a block party again this year on May 17th from 3:00 - 6:00 PM. During this time Woodward will be blocked to thru traffic from Ashfield Lane to Statton Road. Traffic will be diverted around the Milburn loop.

In closing, winter snow and ice have caused some damage to our streets. Our city engineer is working on getting a contractor to repair those areas very soon. As always, please use caution while the work is being completed.

### Did You Know?

### 92.03 PROPERTY MAINTENANCE STANDARDS

It is hereby declared to be a public nuisance for any property owner (or other person in control of the property) to keep or maintain property, premises, or rights-of-way adjacent to the premises, in such a manner which causes, or tends to cause, substantial diminution in value of other properties, or which renders such properties as dangerous, or detrimental, or adverse to the health, or welfare, or offensive to the senses of the residents of the city. This includes, but is not limited to, the following conditions, which are hereby declared a nuisance.

- (A) Grass. All grass within the city limits shall be limited to nine inches in height. All curbs shall be maintained to prohibit any grass from growing over the curb.
- (B) Walkway obstruction. All owners of property abutting a sidewalk shall maintain an unobstructed walkway of at least eight feet in height. Branches or trees and shrubs shall not encroach upon any sidewalk, sidewalk height restriction, nor the 13 feet, six inch vertical clearance required above any roadway.
- (K) Junk; scrap metal, motor vehicles. The storage (unless enclosed within a garage) of motor vehicles in an inoperative condition, motor vehicles unfit for further use, automobile parts, scrap metal or junk.

It's Spring, and change is in the air for sure. This is one of the times of the year—Fall is the other--when I want to skip words and just show you the beauty of the trees in St. Regis Park—but alas, our newsletter is not in color! I do hope, however, that you are taking in the returning shades of green and relaxing to a view of glorious redbuds and dogwoods.

Change is in the air for our tree program, as well. For 10 years we have been guided by the advice of the legendary Cindi Sullivan. She surveyed our front yard trees, reinforcing that we needed to add at least 500 more to front lawns alone. She guided our free tree planting and our maintenance reimbursement efforts. Now, however, with her piloting of the enormously successful Trees Louisville program, Cindi no longer has time to consult for us and we are reluctantly moving on. I know our whole community is grateful for the guidance she gave us for so many years!

We are not moving on, however, from our plans to Re-Tree the Park! We are looking into an exciting new opportunity to plant trees each November through a program already established and working with several small cities in our Metro area. Yes, there will be some changes, with the two most notable being that, for a year at least, we will not have any ornamental trees available. The second is a minor change—because this program is already up and running on an established schedule, you will have to order your tree by AUGUST 10<sup>th</sup> for November plantings. You will have about 6 canopy trees to choose from—the best of any year's 2-inch caliper quality canopy trees. Still free, still planted for you!

We'll send you the details as soon as our plans are finalized. Meanwhile, enjoy the Spring, and dream of getting new trees this Fall!


