Did You Know?

90.01 DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

AT LARGE. *Off the premises of the owner, and not under the control of the owner or his agent either by leash, cord, chain or otherwise.*

OWNER. *Every person having a right of property to an animal and every person who keeps or harbors an animal, has it in his care, or permits it to remain on or about the premises owned or occupied by him.*

90.02 ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE

(A) *No person who is the owner of any animal shall permit it to run at large in any public road, highway, street, lane, or alley, or upon or enclosure without the consent of the owner of the yard, lot, or enclosure.*

(B) *The owner of an animal who permits it to run at large in violation of this section is liable for all damages caused by the animal upon the premises of another.*

90.03 NOISE DISTURBANCE

No person shall keep or harbor any dog within the city which, by frequent and habitual barking, howling, or yelping, creates unreasonably loud and disturbing noises of such a character, intensity, and duration as to disturb the peace, quiet, and good order of one or more of the inhabitants of two or more separate residences. Any person who shall allow any dog habitually to remain, be lodged, or fed within any dwelling, yard, or enclosure which he occupies or owns shall be considered as harboring the dog.

Did You Know?

SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

Regular collection shall be made one time per week on Tuesday between the hours of 6:00 AM and 6:00 PM. Should the regular collection day fall on a holiday (New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day), all collection days for the remainder of that week will be moved back one day.

For any resident who does place their trash at the curbside, Rumpke is required to collect it all, regardless of the number of cans, bags, bundles, or items (as long as it is non-hazardous, household waste). Rumpke shall provide one 96-gallon trash can for curbside pickup, which Rumpke shall supply to each household at no additional cost. For any resident who still requires rear door collection, Rumpke is required to collect a maximum of two (2) cans up to thirty-two (32) gallons in size, of household garbage only.

RECYCLING COLLECTION

Recycling collection shall be at the curbside via one sixty-four (64) gallon recycling cart, which Rumpke shall supply to each household at no additional cost. An additional cart shall be allowed at no additional cost, upon request from the household owner. Rumpke shall collect aluminum cans, steel and tin cans, all colors of glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles and jugs, cartons, office paper, junk mail, folders, magazines, catalogues, phone books, newspaper, cardboard, paperboard and clean pizza boxes.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION - YEAR ROUND

Rumpke shall collect, on a weekly basis, yard waste including grass clippings, tree limbs, leaves and other items that are classified as yard waste. Yard waste shall be placed in paper yard waste bags.

JUNK PICK UP

Rumpke agrees to pick up with its normal collection, at no additional charge, at each collection parcel, a reasonable amount of additional household junk (including one appliance, such as refrigerator, water heater, etc.) in addition to normal collection, if placed at the curbside where garbage is normally picked up. If any resident abuses this additional pickup, Rumpke shall notify City and City will contact the resident to remedy the problem. Rumpke may charge the individual occupant to pick up more than one discarded appliance per pickup and it shall be the duty of occupant to notify Rumpke in advance for appliances. All upholstered furniture, such as mattresses/box springs, must be wrapped and sealed in plastic prior to collection. Appliances that contain Freon must be properly tagged and affixed to appliance prior to collection.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR YARD SALE DAY

IF YOU ARE PARTICIPATING

- Try to set up in your driveway or yard close to the street to be more visible.
- Please park your personal vehicle further up in your driveway so that you do not take space on the street in front of your house and thus help keep the area on the street in front of your home open for traffic and allow parking for buyers coming from outside the City. Any suspicious behavior should be reported immediately.
- People come early, so plan to set up as early as possible.
- Extra police will patrol that day. For any problem, contact them immediately and try to get the license plate number and a car description of an offender's vehicle.
- Join with neighbors and hold a multi-house sale at one location for a larger sale.

IF YOU ARE NOT PARTICIPATING

- Please park your vehicle(s) off the street, but close to the street to avoid your driveway being used as a turn around point.
- Report any suspicious or unusual activity to the police patrolling the City during the yard sale.
- If possible, keep your garage door closed during the hours of the yard sale so that it will not attract attention.

There will be *NO PARKING* on the sides of the streets where fire hydrants are located. "No Parking" signs will be posted on the previous Thursday evening. Police patrols will ticket those vehicles who do not comply.

How to Get Your New Tree This Fall (2025)

- First, take a look at the page of tree choices available for this year. Names and pictures of this year's selections can be found in this newsletter on a separate page. You will note there are far fewer choices than in the past, and for now, we are offering only canopy trees.
- Fill out the Tree Request Form included in this newsletter and return to Susan Messerschmidt by email at smesserschmidt4313@gmail.com or mailing address 4313 Dannywood Rd. Louisville, KY 40220 no later than **Aug. 15, 2025**.
- You should get confirmation from Susan via the email you provided that she has received your request and added you to the list.
- As planting time in November approaches, a member of the Tree Board will leave a white flag in your yard. This is to be used to show the placement of the new tree, so put it in the location you think is best. As you select your location, please keep in mind the mature size of the tree you have requested so that it isn't too close to buildings, other plantings or overhead power lines.
- The next step is for BUD (Before You DIG), now known as Kentucky 811, to visit your property to make sure no utility lines will be disturbed by the digging. **THE TREE BOARD WILL CONTACT KENTUCKY 811 FOR YOU!** They will visit SRP approximately two weeks before the planting is to take place in late November. If their markings indicate your chosen spot for your new tree will interfere with underground utilities, you will need to move the flag to indicate another location for your new tree.
- The final step is the actual planting! Currently we have only one planting per year which is in the fall. Our goal is to have the trees planted by November 30. If there is to be a delay, I will notify you via the email you provided.

That's it! Enjoy your new tree!

Tree Planting Request

As a resident of St. Regis Park, I agree to give the City of St. Regis Park (and its agents) my permission to enter my premises for the purpose of planting trees and to release them from liability for same and further agree that any and all future maintenance of any planted tree or trees is my responsibility. I agree to maintain my new tree(s) to the best of my ability using the guidelines provided by the St Regis Park Tree Board.

I will ensure that my tree(s) receive a regular thorough soaking of the soil in the root zone, and that the soil is kept consistently moist (but not wet) until the tree is well established. I will ensure that my tree(s) maintain a healthy 2-3 inch layer of mulch over the root zone and that the mulch is kept from touching the trunk.

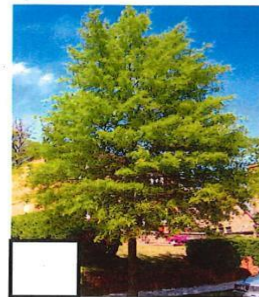

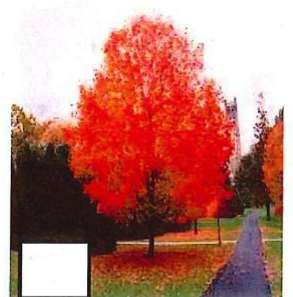
